HOUSE BILL NO. 984

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE STARKVILLE-OKTIBBEHA CONSOLIDATED SCHOOL DISTRICT AND MISSISSIPPI STATE UNIVERSITY, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING, TO ENTER AT THEIR DISCRETION INTO AGREEMENTS FOR THE 5 LEASE OF LANDS AND THE ESTABLISHMENT, CONSTRUCTION, MAINTENANCE 6 AND OPERATION OF A MODEL RURAL EDUCATION SCHOOL TO SERVE THE 7 SIXTH- AND SEVENTH-GRADE STUDENT POPULATION OF OKTIBBEHA COUNTY; TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI MIDDLE SCHOOL UNIVERSITY-BASED ACADEMY; 8 9 TO PROVIDE THAT THE ACADEMY SHALL BE A MODEL SCHOOL FOR THE 10 EDUCATION OF SIXTH AND SEVENTH GRADE STUDENTS IN OKTIBBEHA COUNTY 11 AND FOR THE EDUCATION OF TEACHERS AND ADMINISTRATORS ENROLLED IN 12 THE COLLEGE OF EDUCATION AT MISSISSIPPI STATE UNIVERSITY; TO PROVIDE THAT THE 2017-2018 SCHOOL YEAR SHALL BE THE ACADEMY'S FIRST YEAR OF OPERATION; TO REQUIRE THE SCHOOL BOARD OF THE 14 15 STARKVILLE-OKTIBBEHA CONSOLIDATED SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE COLLEGE 16 OF EDUCATION AT MISSISSIPPI STATE UNIVERSITY TO JOINTLY GOVERN THE 17 ACADEMY; TO REQUIRE THE LEGISLATURE TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THE 18 2017 FISCAL YEAR TO THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR THE 19 CONSTRUCTION OF THE ACADEMY; TO REPEAL SECTION 37-131-15, 20 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH AUTHORIZES THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A 21 TEACHER'S DEMONSTRATION OR PRACTICE SCHOOL IN OKTIBBEHA COUNTY; 22 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 2.3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. (1) The Starkville-Oktibbeha Consolidated School 24 25 District and Mississippi State University, with the approval of 26 the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, 27 are authorized and empowered, in their individual discretion, to 28 enter into an agreement for the purpose of designing,

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- 29 constructing, maintaining and operating a model rural education
- 30 school to serve all sixth- and seventh-grade students residing in
- 31 Oktibbeha County. The Starkville-Oktibbeha Consolidated School
- 32 District and Mississippi State University are further authorized
- 33 and empowered, in their individual discretion, to transfer funds
- 34 to the other and expend such funds on mutually agreeable terms and
- 35 conditions for the construction, maintenance and operation of such
- 36 school.
- 37 (2) Subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees of
- 38 State Institutions of Higher Learning, Mississippi State
- 39 University is authorized and empowered, in its discretion, to
- 40 lease lands under its possession and control to the
- 41 Starkville-Oktibbeha Consolidated School District, and the
- 42 Starkville-Oktibbeha Consolidated School District is authorized
- 43 and empowered, in its discretion, to lease from Mississippi State
- 44 University, upon mutually agreeable terms and conditions, lands
- 45 under the possession and control of said university which are
- 46 deemed suitable for the development of a model rural education
- 47 school to serve all sixth- and seventh-grade students residing in
- 48 Oktibbeha County, for a term not to exceed ninety-nine (99) years.
- 49 Any such lease shall not be cancelled by successor boards based on
- 50 the binding successor doctrine.
- 51 **SECTION 2.** (1) There is created the Mississippi Middle
- 52 School University-based Academy, which shall be a model school for
- 53 students in the sixth and seventh grades, located in Oktibbeha

- 54 County, Mississippi. The purpose of the school shall be to
- 55 provide the optimum educational opportunity for sixth and seventh
- 56 grade students in the Starkville-Oktibbeha Consolidated School
- 57 District and a model teaching program for the education of
- 58 teachers and administrators enrolled in the College of Education
- 59 at Mississippi State University through an educational partnership
- 60 between the school district and the College of Education.
- 61 (2) The 2017-2018 school year shall be the first year that
- 62 the academy may admit students for enrollment.
- 63 (3) Admission to the Mississippi Middle School
- 64 University-based Academy must be open to all sixth and seventh
- 65 grade students residing in the Starkville-Oktibbeha Consolidated
- 66 School District. The academy may not limit admission based on
- 67 ethnicity, national origin, religion, gender, income level,
- 68 disabling condition, proficiency in the English language, or
- 69 academic or athletic ability. If capacity is insufficient to
- 70 enroll all students who wish to attend the academy, students must
- 71 be selected through a lottery process that is equitable,
- 72 randomized, transparent and impartial in order for every student
- 73 to have an equal opportunity for enrollment. However, students
- 74 returning to the academy after completing the sixth grade at the
- 75 academy must be given an enrollment preference.
- 76 (4) The Mississippi Middle School University-based Academy
- 77 shall be governed jointly by the School Board of the
- 78 Starkville-Oktibbeha Consolidated School District and the College

- 79 of Education at Mississippi State University. The school board
- 80 and College of Education shall execute an agreement clearly
- 81 defining the roles and responsibilities of the school district and
- 82 the College of Education in the administration and operation of
- 83 the academy. It shall be the duty of the school board, acting
- 84 jointly with the College of Education, to:
- 85 (a) Develop a detailed plan relating to the
- 86 construction, opening, operation, maintenance and funding of the
- 87 academy to be presented to the Legislature before the 2017 Regular
- 88 Session;
- 89 (b) Promulgate policies, rules and regulations
- 90 necessary for the administration and operation of the academy;
- 91 (c) Employ administrators, teachers and other licensed
- 92 and noninstructional personnel at the appropriate time for the
- 93 academy;
- 94 (d) Develop the annual budget for the academy; and
- 95 (e) Undertake any other actions that may be necessary
- 96 in the establishment and operation of the academy.
- 97 (5) The School Board of the Starkville-Oktibbeha
- 98 Consolidated School District and the College of Education at
- 99 Mississippi State University may solicit assistance from the staff
- 100 of the State Department of Education and the Board of Trustees of
- 101 State Institutions of Higher Learning as required for the
- 102 implementation of this act. In addition, the board and College of
- 103 Education, acting jointly, may enter into such contracts or

- agreements as may be deemed necessary to carry out the purposes and intent of this act.
- 106 (6) The school board of the Starkville-Oktibbeha
- 107 Consolidated School District and the College of Education at
- 108 Mississippi State University may receive contributions, donations,
- 109 gifts, bequests of money, other forms of financial assistance as
- 110 well as property, equipment, materials or labor from any public or
- 111 private source for the construction, operation and support of the
- 112 Mississippi Middle School University-based Academy.
- SECTION 3. For the 2017 fiscal year, the Legislature shall
- 114 appropriate an amount of not less than Thirty Million Dollars
- 115 (\$30,000,000.00) from any available state funds, including any
- 116 proceeds of general obligation bonds that may be authorized by
- 117 the Legislature for the construction of the Mississippi Middle
- 118 School University-based Academy, to the State Department of
- 119 Education for the exclusive purpose of implementation of this act.
- 120 **SECTION 4.** Section 37-131-15, Mississippi Code of 1972,
- 121 which authorizes Oktibbeha County and the former Starkville
- 122 Municipal Separate School District to cooperate with the Board of
- 123 Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning in the
- 124 establishment and operation of a teacher's demonstration or
- 125 practice school, is repealed.
- 126 **SECTION 5.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 127 and after July 1, 2016.
