

In Golden Triangle, the villages are stepping up in child education

Community partnerships provide growth, opportunities in area schools

The spring morning was overcast as prekindergarten students file out of a door at Partnership Middle School, eagerly gathering around picnic tables outside. Wearing blue lab coats, they each receive a clear bag with a strawberry and a chemical inside from the Mississippi State University Student Members of the American Chemical Society.

As the young students begin kneading the strawberry, a white goo separates from the mixture.

Excited squeals erupt as a student yells, "I found DNA!"

DNA, as it turns out, is in everything.

School and community collaborations have become a key component for area districts to give students outside exposure even within the school walls.

The Starkville-Oktibbeha Consolidated School District has several community partners, including Mississippi State University, OCH Regional Medical Center and Starkville Utilities.

These partnerships impact the classroom at all grade levels, said Haley Montgomery, public information officer for SOCSO.

With the SOCSO's Academic Houses curriculum, high schoolers connect their classroom experiences to a career track of their choosing, Montgomery said. Those houses include Technology, Engineering and Construction (TEC), Health and Human Service (H2S), and Communications, Art and Business (CAB).

SOCSO has several community partners through this program, including MSU. Specifically, the district has collaborated with the Department of Chemistry, the College of Veterinary Medicine, and the Advanced Composites Institute (ACI). The university also hosts enrichment camps for the students during fall and spring intercessions.

Through ACI, SOCSO has had "several seniors this past year who have had a yearlong internship ... they have now got a resume with a whole year's worth of an internship in a real industry related organization," said Montgomery.

Furthermore, OCH has hosted several classes for students – most recently partnering with the district to provide internships for disabled Starkville High alumni – and Starkville Utilities has visited chemistry classes to do an energy-saving seminar and other experiments for students as well.

"(These partnerships) tend to give our students a real world look at different industries and career opportunities," Montgomery said. "... It's hard for a student to dream about doing something if they don't even know it exists."

Columbus Municipal School District also has several community partners. Columbus Police Department,

Columbus Fire and Rescue, Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, and Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity frequently visit classrooms and read books to students.

"Having these community members in the classroom is so important," said Mary Pollitz, public information officer for CMSD. "Any time we have visitors mentoring and interacting with our students, it brightens their day."

Columbus Light and Water regularly mentors and speaks with the CMSD students, Pollitz said. Numerous classes have toured their facility, and the business has also spoken at school career days.

"Working with the schools is a good way for us to get inside of the classroom and help students to understand what we do and how that impacts their lives," said Angela Verdell, general manager of Columbus Light and Water. "It allows (the students) to have a better understanding of where the utilities come from."

CMSD is proud of these strong community partnerships that have been created, and there is a direct

correlation between community involvement and student success, said Superintendent Stanley Ellis.

"I know these partnerships and relationships will serve our students throughout the year in numerous capacities," Ellis said. "We are thankful for the partners we have and will continue building these vital relationships."

Lowndes County School District boasts more than 20 community partners through its Career and Technical Center. FORGE, Brislin Inc, Benton's Maintenance and Mechanical and Weldon Electric all partner with the center's shop classes. For health science classes, partners include Baptist Memorial Hospital-Golden Triangle and Aurora Health and Rehabilitation.

Susan McClelland, director for the Career and Technical Center, said these industry partners have provided field trips, guest speakers, and internships for students.

"We appreciate all the local industries that pour into our Career Tech Center," said McClelland.

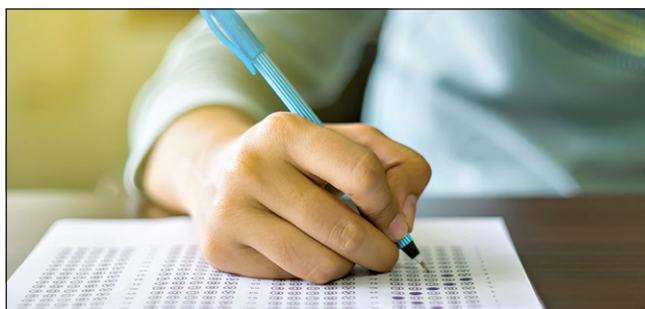
Tips to get your student prepped for college entrance exams

Is the SAT or ACT on the horizon for your high schooler? A lot of emphasis is placed on college entrance exams, and your child may be anxious about their scores. To adequately prepare for the SAT or ACT, consider these tips:

- **Practice, practice, practice:** Encourage your student to take free online practice tests early and often. Not only is this an effective way to get familiar with the types of questions that will be on the test, it can give your child a sense of where they stand currently and help them identify areas where they may need some extra review. - **Build vocabulary:** An expansive vocabulary is not just useful in the real world, it can greatly improve a student's chances of success in the English, reading and writing sections of the exam. Getting familiar with some of the more frequently used words on the test is important. However, it's best to break up the studying into chunks. Select a few words to master each day with flash cards. Hopefully, students will start to see etymological patterns that will help them make educated guesses when they don't know a word.

- **Take a break:** It's tempting to assume a last-minute study session the evening before the exam is going to make or break their performance, but a mental breather is actually a better use of time. Urge your child to get a good night's sleep not just the night before the test, but that entire week. Pre-test jitters may lead to insomnia, but having a solid foundation of rest will help ensure your student is alert on test day. The morning of the test, encourage them to eat a healthy, filling breakfast and do activities that will warm up their brain, such as reading a book or solving a crossword puzzle.
