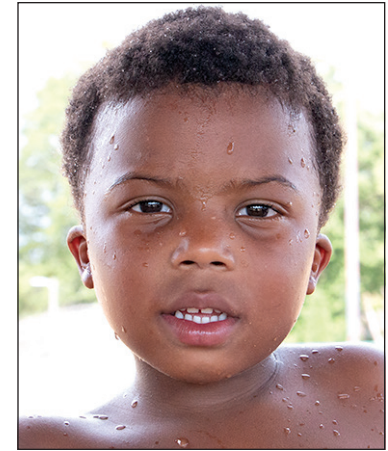

# Communication, early introductions are key to managing back to school anxiety

**‘Let them express what their concerns are, and validate their concerns’**

While the start of a new school year is filled with excitement over starting new classes and reuniting with old friends, some students can find the back to school season overwhelming.

Lesley Jones, a sixth-grade counselor at Partnership Middle School in Starkville, said the sudden routine shift from summer to a school routine can exacerbate students' anxiety.

"I think the biggest struggle is just ... the fear of the unknown," Jones said. "They're usually moving into new classes with maybe students they've never had classes with before and teachers they've never had. So there's a lot of stress and anxiety on the kid's part that comes with starting back to school just because of the unknown."

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, about 5.8 million children between ages 3 and 17 had diagnosed anxiety in 2016 to 2019.

Jacqueline McMath, a behavior specialist with the Columbus Municipal School District, said she's seen anxiety in students become more frequent, especially at the start of the school year.

"Anxiety is really on the rise with our students," she said. "I'm finding out more and more students are dealing with anxiety. At the beginning of school, I see a lot of anxiety with students with the transition."

Whether it's moving to a new school, having new teachers or a different classroom, McMath said the sudden changes that come with the new school year can induce anxiety for students. Her biggest tip for parents supporting a student with back to school anxiety is to reintroduce the student to the school environment before the year even starts.

"What I always encourage parents to do, whether (the student) is transitioning to a new classroom or a new school, I always encourage them to try to come early," she said. "Bring the child with them early before school starts, so they can kind of familiarize them with the buildings, with their classrooms, and meet the teachers if they can."

Asking the teacher about the class routine and practicing the drop-off and pick-up process could also help ease students' anxiety about the daily routine, McMath said.

Jones suggests that parents start the year out with

an open line of communication, so students feel comfortable discussing their anxieties about school.

"The big thing is to talk to your kid," she said. "If you will just ask them, it may not be the first time, but they're going to tell you what's going on or what they need help with."

McMath said it is important to validate the students' worries when it comes to dealing with change.

"Let them express what their concerns are, and validate their concerns," she said. "It's OK to be a little nervous and scared about going to a new teacher, to a new classroom. ... So validate their concerns, and let them know that it's OK for them to feel that way."

Jones said parents should also be aware of what mental health resources their child has access to at school, starting with their school counselor.

"As a parent, you can contact your school counselor, and they can help be on your side," she said. "Some things are too big, and so as a parent, you may need to send an email ... It's OK to reach out

for help within the school because we have them for eight hours a day."

Make sure students know when they're having a mental health problem, Jones said. When students at her school need help, she said the first step is giving them space to cool down.

"In the school, we have a calm room that has just different sensory stuff as well as a couch where they can chill out for a while," she said. "That's our first step, to remove them and give them a space where they can use tools and techniques that we work with them on to calm themselves down and self-regulate."

Using tools for self-regulation, McMath said, is a great way for students to manage anxious feelings as they start back to school.

"(Use) deep breathing and counting to calm down and tell yourself you're OK," she said. "When you're upset, you don't think rationally or clearly. So once they settle down, they can think more clearly, and then they realize it's not as bad as they think it is."

Class options are available year-round. Fall 2024 classes begin August 19.

# Tips to help students be better writers

No matter the career path students pursue, writing and communication skills are essential to success. Whether a student identifies as a “math kid,” a “sports kid,” or even a “reading kid,” writing doesn’t always come naturally.

Parents and teachers need to be creative in how they present writing, so students feel personally motivated to develop their skills.

“Almost any student is capable of becoming a strong, passionate writer,” says Rowana Miller, founder and executive director of creative writing education nonprofit Cosmic Writers. “The trick is in connecting writing to the activities, subjects and ideas that already excite them.”

Here are some tips from Miller to motivate kids to strengthen writing skills:

### Present writing as fun

Especially for students between the ages of 8-12, who have developed basic writing skills but may not have a defined sense of what it means to be a “writer,” it is essential to create positive associations with the act of writing.

To accomplish this, you can teach writing through gamified, collaborative and imaginative activities. For example, you can guide kids through the process of writing a series of “telephone stories.” With students sitting in a circle, have each one write an opening

sentence on a piece of paper, and then pass the paper to the student to their right. Each student should continue the story by adding a sentence to the page, and then pass the paper a second time. This process repeats until each student has their original paper again.

### Provide engaging materials

When kids’ writing practice only comes from dry textbooks, it is difficult to create positive associations with writing. Experts recommend using materials that are just as fun as the activities good teachers use

when teaching.

For example, the 8-12 age range is well-served by such exciting activity books as “The Monster-Building Handbook,” a new publication from Cosmic Writers. “The Monster-Building Handbook” combines a narrative premise with a call-to-action for students to practice writing: fictional monster-maker Angelica Fearborne needs them to develop an original monster character who can face off against her monster-hunter twin brother. ### Link writing to favorite shows & video games

Students don’t usually recognize the connection between writing and the media they love. Writing becomes more exciting when they learn that writing is an essential part of a funny YouTube series or thrilling video game.

Students are particularly compelled by opportunities to write in the style of the media they enjoy. For example, if you are working with kids who like to play Dungeons and Dragons, it is a natural next step to practice fantasy storytelling and writing.

For almost any student, it is possible to find a connection between writing and something they already like. A “math kid” may engage most with genres that emphasize logic and problem-solving, like mystery-writing. A “sports kid” may be excited to write articles about the school baseball team. And when these students practice these kinds of writing, they may discover they have been “writing kids” all along.

# Start the school year strong and prevent illness in children

The excitement of a new school year unfolds each year when families flood the superstore aisles to buy classroom supplies, tape after-school schedules on the fridge and organize carpools with friends.

Common to each family is a desire for children to remain healthy, active and ready to learn.

To prepare children and teens to be at their best – physically, mentally, socially and emotionally – the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) recommends regular visits with the pediatrician, as well as immunizations that help keep all family members healthy. Recent outbreaks of measles, a highly contagious disease, have shown how quickly some infectious diseases can spread

within a community.

“The best way to strengthen a child’s immune system and keep them healthy is by getting them vaccinated,” said pediatrician, Dr. David M. Higgins. “An illness like measles can keep children home and away from school and activities for days. Immunizations allow children to enjoy learning, playing and getting together with friends and family.”

As of June 13, 2024, a total of 151 U.S. measles cases were reported this year-to-date in 21 different states, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. These recent measles outbreaks have affected unvaccinated people. Choosing to not vaccinate your children not only leaves them susceptible to measles, but also exposes other children to this potentially serious disease. This includes infants who are

too young to be vaccinated and those who are unable to be vaccinated due to other health conditions.

“Everyone in our community deserves to be healthy, and part of being healthy means getting immunized for all illnesses, including influenza and COVID-19 and, if eligible, respiratory syncytial virus (RSV). It benefits all of us if every child in our community is vaccinated, because it means that all of us are more likely to be healthy,” says Dr. Higgins.


Families can also stop the spread of infection by encouraging hand washing with children throughout the day. Help or remind them to wash their hands:

- Before eating (including snacks)
- After a trip to the bathroom
- Whenever they come in from playing outdoors

- After touching an animal, like a family pet
- After sneezing or coughing if they cover their mouth
- When someone in the household is ill

The AAP calls for the immunization of all children and adolescents according to its policy, Recommended Immunization Schedules for Children and Adolescents Aged 18 Years or Younger, United States. More information can be found at [healthychildren.org](http://healthychildren.org).

“Your pediatrician can answer any questions about recommended vaccines and when your child needs them,” Dr. Higgins said. “There is a schedule for their recommended timing because that is when research has shown they are most effective during a child’s development.”
