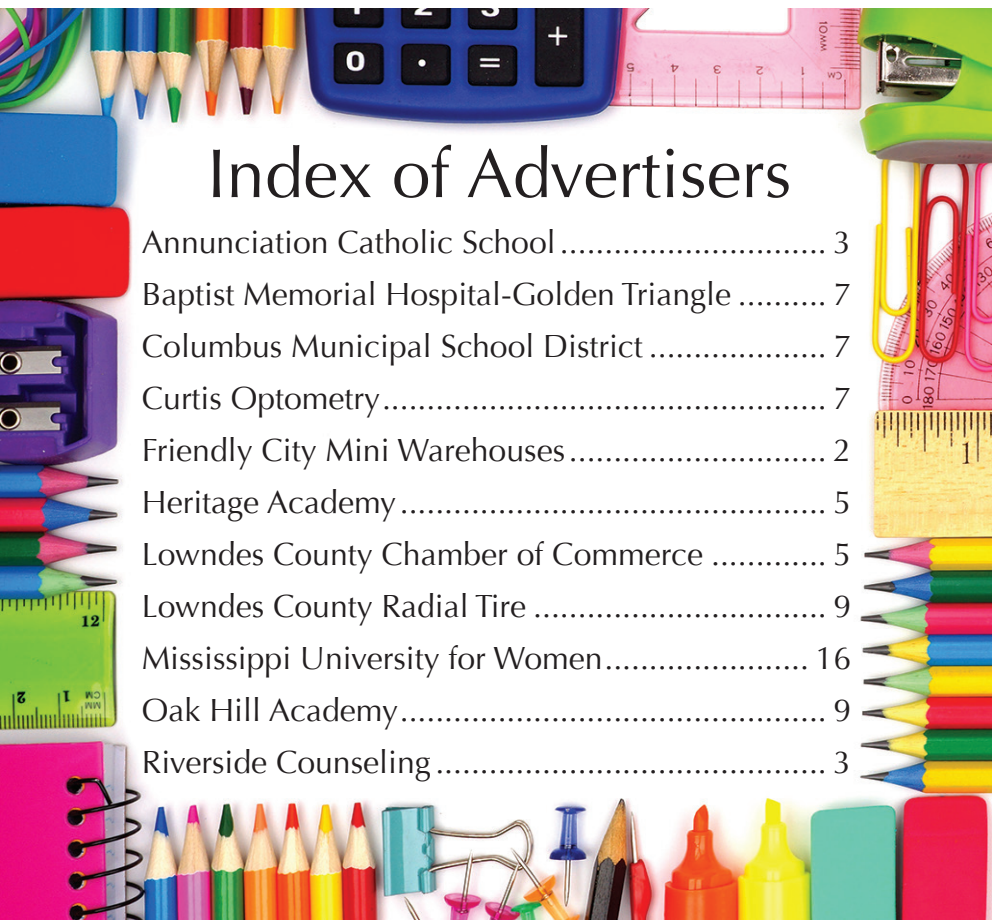

# Supporting your special needs student during the back to school season

**Proactive communication is key to ensuring student needs are met in the classroom**

**F**or students with special needs, preparing for the first day of school may require more than new pencils and fresh notebooks.

The return to routine can be overwhelming for students with behavioral challenges, disabilities or learning differences and their families, especially without the right support in place.

School district officials across the Golden Triangle agree maintaining communication with administrators and teachers is the best way for parents to ensure their special needs students are walking into a classroom that understands their needs.

"We want to have an open line of communication (so) we can know what we need to know about the student as educators, and that way, we can push forward from that," said Valerie Bailey, director of special education for Columbus Municipal School District.

All public school districts in Mississippi are required by law to provide services to students with special needs. Services are guided by students' Individualized Education Programs, which ensure services are tailored to each student's specific needs.

Jorine Neal, student support services director for Starkville-Oktibbeha Consolidated School District, said the IEP transfer process from classroom to classroom typically happens at the end of the school year. But parents can communicate with the district throughout the year if their student's IEP requires adjusting.

"Each school is equipped with a lead special ed teacher who helps in the transition for the next grade up," she said. "... Those IEPs get transferred to the next buildings, and in that transfer, the receiving schools, along with the teachers, have conversations specific to this child's academic, emotional (and) behavioral needs."

This time of year, Neal said educators are working to create an environment that ensures each student can be successful in the new school year. That often requires parents to help district officials determine how they can best serve their child, she said.

"Some parents have just reached out even before open house, just to have those meetings with the ad-

ministration, possibly a counselor, that receiving team of teachers just to speak about their child specifically before the rush of everybody coming in," Neal said.

But before the year starts, Bailey said it's important to communicate any summer changes that could have an impact on their student's behavior.

"If there are any concerns ... I need them to express that to the teachers so we can be aware of something that may have happened over the summer," Bailey said. "Any changes. It could be from medication to anything that can affect the child's learning. So be open and honest with us on changes that may have happened in the summer or concerns that they may have."

To make the process as smooth as possible, Lowndes County School District Special Education Director Rhonda Locke encourages parents to keep thorough

medical and education records.

Collaborating with the school team as a partner is also crucial, she said.

"If a child is found to be (Mississippi Department of Education) eligible for special education services, parents can actively participate in IEP meetings, share insights about their child's needs, and suggest accommodations or services to help create a plan that best supports their child's success," Locke said. "By being proactive, organized, and informed, parents can help facilitate a smoother and more effective process for getting special education services started for their child."

Locke said the annual adjustment of returning to school can trigger behavior changes in some students.

"These can include difficulty re-establishing

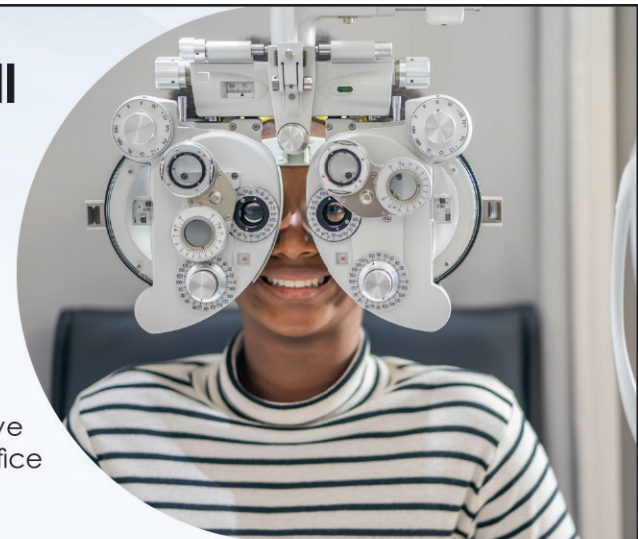

# 7 things doctors wish families knew this back to school season

As you prepare children to return to the classroom this fall, the American Medical Association (AMA) has seven tips to help your family have a healthy school year.

“As you purchase school supplies and prepare the students in your family for academic success, you can take concrete steps that prioritize physical and mental health, too,” said AMA President Bobby Mukkamala, M.D. “A healthy start can set the tone for a strong, successful year ahead.”

1. Ultra-processed foods are associated with health risks. Many busy families rely on ultra-processed foods due to their convenience. However, consuming these foods regularly increases the risk of health complications, including cardiovascular disease, certain cancers, obesity and type 2 diabetes. Read nutrition labels carefully with attention to sodium, saturated fat and added sugar, shop the perimeter of the grocery store where fresh, whole foods tend to be located, and prepare meals that prioritize whole foods, including fruits and vegetables, for growing children and adults.

2. Eating disorders are misunderstood. This silent epidemic affects people of all ages and backgrounds, striking at the core of their physical and mental well-being. Despite its widespread impact, the gravity of eating disorders often remains private, leaving many to battle the condition silently. If you believe your child or teenager has an eating disorder, their physician can direct you to helpful resources.

3. Ensure your vaccinations are up to date. Vaccinations help protect you and your family against severe disease and disability, and save millions of lives

each year. Check with your physician during the back-to-school season to ensure everyone in the family is up to date on vaccinations. When respiratory virus season starts later in the fall, get up to date on the influenza vaccine to help reduce time away from school or work.

“It’s one of the simplest and most effective ways to protect your child, their classmates, and the broader community,” said Amy Bogue, director for Allegro Family Clinic in Columbus.

4. Norovirus is very contagious, but preventable. It seems everyone has experienced the sudden turn of the stom-

ach, causing a mad rush to the bathroom due to vomiting, diarrhea or both. And, unfortunately, remaining near the bathroom may be the only plan for the next day or two. The most likely culprit is norovirus, and it can happen to anyone. When buying school supplies, stock up on cleaning supplies as well so you can keep frequently touched surfaces sanitized. Model good hand-washing habits for your children. Keep children with norovirus symptoms home from school for at least two days (48 hours) after symptoms stop to help prevent the spread of the virus.

5. Too much screen time is bad for health. People are on their devices

more than ever before. But too much screen time can have negative mental and physical health effects and increase feelings of loneliness. The start of a new school year is a good time to replace screen time with other activities, such as after school clubs and sports, playdates, quality family time and sleep.

“Setting healthy boundaries around screens now will help create balance and structure as the school year begins,” Bogue said.

6. Eye health is essential. Don’t take eye health for granted. Fall is a good time for an ophthalmologist checkup. If your tween or teen wears contacts, be sure that they wash their lenses and lens case and take their lenses off at night. Frequent computer breaks, wearing sunglasses, and a healthy diet can also promote good eye health.

7. Sleep is important for overall health. From school stress to illnesses, many factors can interfere with a good night’s sleep. Instituting a consistent sleep routine for the entire family is a good start. For teens, 8-10 hours of sleep is recommended, and children aged 6-12 should be getting 9-12 hours of sleep. Consider consulting a physician for persistent sleep issues to determine whether they’re caused by a sleep disorder and to get help.

“Establishing a healthy sleep routine can also make a big difference,” Bogue said. “Begin adjusting bedtimes at least a week before school starts to ease the transition. Kids need consistent, restful sleep to support learning, memory, and emotional regulation.”

routines, separation worries, struggles with social interactions, and behavioral escalations due to stress or uncertainty,” Locke said. “Some students may find it challenging to adapt to new environments, teachers, or peers, which can

result in behaviors such as defiance or withdrawal.”

To help their child through the transition, Locke said parents can start preparing their students before the year even starts by discussing upcoming

changes and reviewing routines and expectations.

“Parents can also support social skills development by practicing positive interactions and encouraging playdates or community activities,” she said. “... ”

Reinforcing positive behavior at home, promoting coping strategies for worries, and being actively involved in the school community are all essential ways parents can support their child’s successful transition.”
